Specialists at the Allegheny Link can connect you to the following types of programs and services that are provided through the DHS Office of Data Analysis, Research and Evaluation. The Allegheny Link staff will help you determine which is right for you.

Rental assistance

Rental assistance is for individuals or families facing eviction from their rented property because of non-payment of rent. Rental assistance may also assist with first month's rent and/or security deposit for those who are homeless.

Emergency shelters

Emergency shelters are for individuals and families in immediate need of emergency accommodations who have no other housing option.

The Bureau of Homeless Services also offers shelters specifically for:

- Unaccompanied youth (ages 18-24)
- Persons fleeing domestic violence
- Persons who identify as LGBTQ

Winter Shelter

Individuals who generally live on the street can take refuge in a Winter Shelter between November 15 and March 15.

Permanent housing

Permanent housing is available for individuals with disabilities, for families with a family member with a disability, and individuals who would otherwise be living on the street (chronic street homeless). Residents may remain as long as necessary. Each program offers additional services to help participants become more independent. Occupancy fees are based on a sliding scale.

Rapid Rehousing

Rapid Rehousing helps people move from homelessness to permanent housing in the community through housing search assistance, rental assistance, and service coordination.

Transitional and Bridge housing

Transitional and Bridge housing helps individuals and families with housing for up to 24 months. Each program offers additional services to help participants become more independent. Occupancy fees are based on a sliding scale.

PennFree Bridge housing

PennFree Bridge housing helps individuals and families who are homeless and for whom alcohol and/or drug addiction were/are factors in their ability to maintain housing.
