

IMPORTANT UPDATE

SNAP PAYMENTS DELAYED

Because of the ongoing federal government shutdown, SNAP payments (food stamps) are delayed. People will start missing monthly benefits on November 3.

 No new benefits will be added to EBT cards until funding resumes.



- Current balances remain active.
- Back benefits will be issued when payments restart.



What will missing SNAP payments mean for our neighbors?

 160,000+ people in Allegheny County, including 50,000 children, will not receive their food benefits on time. This could amount to \$30 million in November alone

that people cannot spend on

local groceries.

 Nearly 80% of SNAP participants live in families with children, seniors or people with disabilities.





This is a time to check on neighbors and connect them to help.

Other Assistance Programs Are Still Available

Even while SNAP payments are paused, other basic needs programs are still available.

WIC: Nutrition support for pregnant and postpartum women, infants, and children under 5. Call 412-350-5801 to schedule your enrollment appointment.

Utility Assistance: Help with heating, water, and electric bills. Contact your utility company to ask about customer assistance programs.

Allegheny Go: Discounted transit fares for Allegheny County residents ages 12-64 who have a household member receiving SNAP benefits. Apply at:
